## Tell The Next Generation of Believers...*Preserving the Spiritual Life of Our Children*

**Judges 2:10** says this, "And all that generation also were gathered to their fathers. And there arose another generation after them who did not know the Lord or the work that He had done for Israel." The Joshua generations before him were a society that passed its stories down. Abraham was chosen "that he may command his children and his household after him to keep the way of the Lord by doing righteousness and justice, so that the Lord may bring to Abraham what he has promised him." (Gen. 18:19).

Yet, the generation after Joshua somehow failed to pass on to their generation the most important stories of all, the stories of God. God had provided for the passing of this information by giving them families, speeches, and memories. He instructed Priests to teach these to the people (Lev. 10:11). God had provided for them the entire system of festivals, memorials, and other customs. For example, the Children of Israel were to observe the Passover Feast of Unleavened Bread to commemorate the Lord's deliverance of them out of Egypt. This Passover celebration was to become a testimony for future Israelite generation. Moses instructed them to keep the "Passover" as a story to pass down so "That all the days of your life you may remember the day when you came out of the land of Egypt" (Deut. 16:3).

They had set up memorials like the one at the crossing of Jordan in Joshua's day (Josh. 4). When their children would see these memorials and ask about them, they would tell their children that the waters of the Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the Lord. So, these stones shall be to the people of Israel a memorial forever" (Josh. 4:7)

What stories about God are you passing down to your children? Our next generation of believers must know the wonderful things God has performed in our lives. They need to find hope during these dark days in knowing that God's love is unfailing, and that He genuinely cares about every detail impacting our lives. They need to know that God is still the God of miracles. He is still the God who parted the Red Sea, rained manna from Heaven, caused the walls of Jericho to fall, shut the lion's mouths, healed the sick, raised the dead, calmed the sea, and that He still performs miracles today. We need to tell these remarkable stories to the **Next Generation of Believers**. If you are a parent, grandparent, aunt, uncle, Sunday School teacher, Youth Pastor or Senior Pastor it is your spiritual responsibility to share with the next generation of believers how God parted "Red Sea" circumstances in your life.

I recently spent time reading and reflecting on **Psalm 78**. And as I studied this Psalm, I was reminded of my Grand Aunt Liza. She was my grandmother's sister, my dad's aunt, and the only grandmother figure I can recall. If anyone was a sanctified, Holy Ghost-filled and a fire-baptized witness for the Lord Jesus Christ, it was my Aunt Liza. She was a prayer warrior and the "Mother" of our local church, "Number One Holiness Church," Cades, South Carolina, where we frequent as children. Aunt Liza was born in 1882 and went home to be with the Lord in 1996.

Before transitioning in 1996 at the ripe age of 114, Aunt Liza gave our family a great gift by passing down the history of her long life of faith in her Great God. She shared with us ways God performed miracles in her life, and how God freed her from appalling living conditions and rescued her from near-death experiences. I can recall her words as if they were speaking to me today.

There are seven generations after the generation of my Aunt Liza. Her subsequent generations are believers in the Lord Jesus Christ. I am a believer today because of Aunt Liza's resoluteness to live a faith-full life visible before her family and serve her God faithfully each day. She shared amazing stories of God's protection, provisions, and deliverances. I further believe that by hearing her stories as a child growing up, a seed of faith was planted in my heart to know and trust God in a personal way today. Hearing her faith-full stories as a child has prepared my heart to live fully for the Lord Jesus Christ. Today, I am a mother of two adult children who are believers, and three grandchildren who are growing strongly in the knowledge of God.

As did Aunt Liza, I purposefully speak to my children and grandchildren about our Faithful God. I often share with them, stories of how God made, and continues to make countless provisions for our family. One story that I shared passionately with my children and grandchildren is how God, during one painful "winter" season of my life as a divorcee with two small children, and how God used the mighty hand and heart of Pastor Charles B. Jackson, Sr. to powerfully rescued my family from this very "dark place." Saints, if we are to preserve the spiritual lives of our children, our stories must be told to them.

This is what **Psalm 78:1-8** in the **NIV** says about preserving the spiritual life of the next generation. *"My people, hear my teaching; listen to the words of my mouth. I will open my mouth with a parable; I will utter hidden things, things from of old things we have heard and known, things our ancestors have told us. We will not hide them from their descendants. **We will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, his power, and the wonders he has done.** He decreed statutes for Jacob and established the law in Israel, which he commanded our ancestors to instruct their children, so the next generation would know them, even the children yet to be born, and they in turn would tell their children. Then they would put their trust in God and would not forget his deeds but would keep his commands. They would not be like their ancestors—a stubborn and rebellious generation, whose hearts were not loyal to God, whose spirits were not faithful to him."*

**Psalm 78** encourages us to continue the tradition of passing on the record of God's marvelous works from one generation to another.

In verse one, the psalmist asks for our attention. *"Give ear, o my people, to my law; incline your ears to the words of my mouth."* In our terminology, he is showing strong emotions, as sometimes I did as a classroom teacher; "Pay attention boys and girls! This is important stuff that I am about to teach you!" God is trying to get our attention. Listen to Him.

As Believers in the Lord Jesus Christ, we know that God, through His Word admonishes us to tell the next generations of believers about His infallible work in history. We are to tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, His power, and the wonders and love for us. I am so grateful that our Loving Father did not leave it up to us as Christian parents to plan nor create a set of courses about what to teach the next generation of believers. God, in His Sovereign wisdom, predetermined and revealed Himself in the pages of Scripture with instructions about what we must teach the next generation, and how we are to prepare them for "**Kingdom Call.**"

In the same breath, He tells us why teaching the next generation is so critical. Here is **what** He instructs us to teach: We must teach the next generation the history of God's Sovereignty, His character and faithfulness in our lives. Here is **why** we must teach this. So *"That they might set their hope in God, and not forget the works of God, but keep his commandments: And might not be as their fathers, a stubborn and rebellious generation; a generation that set not their heart aright, and whose spirit was not steadfast with God."*

Intuitively, or shall I say that it was by the Spirit of the Living God that my Aunt Liza knew to pass on this Spiritual mandate to her family. She taught us by word and example, to love God and others, treasure His Word, serve His church, and tell others of God's goodness.

**Psalm 78** gives us four fundamental truths regarding our responsibility to future generations. Let us look at these four Truths found in this Psalm.

The first truth is **Who** must teach the next generation?

From the time God established His covenant with Israel, He placed the responsibility on parents for the spiritual education of children. We believe that the local church is a part of a community of faith and has a vital role in the spiritual training of children. However, the church can never replace the role of the family, and the family cannot do it alone without the church to serve as the "Spiritual Helper" in helping parents to accomplish their primary responsibility of parenting.

The second truth is **WHAT** we must instruct our children.

We are to teach our children the **Praiseworthy Deeds of God**. The praiseworthy deeds of God are the incomparable works He has done in our lives. The miracles He has performed, the amazing power only He possesses. We must tell our children that God's power is above all other powers, and nothing is too difficult for Him. It is our responsibility to teach our children, our grandchildren, and our spiritual children about God's greatness (Ps. 145:3, 4).

The third truth is **WHY** we must teach the next generation?

So, why must we teach the next generation? Psalm 78 also answers the "**Why**" question in verses 6-7. We teach the next generation for these reasons:

- \* So that they "might know" God through His Word (v. 6)
- \* So that they might trust Him ("put their confidence in God," v. 7)
- \* So that they would obey Him ("keep his commands," v. 7).

We must teach our children the Word of God so that they may know, trust, and learn to trust God. This desired outcome goes beyond just hoping our kids will stay out of trouble. For us, it means we seek to raise up faithful and enthusiastic followers of Jesus Christ.

The fourth truth is **HOW** We are to teach the next generation.

Again, Psalm 78 provides answers. We are to teach them orally, experientially, set up family memorials and festivals, and have them rehearse stories told to them. God has blessed the Brookland Church family with a powerful and effective Youth and Teen's Center and Ministry under the immediate direction of an anointed Youth Pastor, Elder Mark Richard. These Youth and teens are thriving in the works of the Lord! They will cherish all the great experiences for a lifetime and will have powerful testimonies to pass on to their next generation. My, what a Powerful and Mighty God we serve!

In conclusion, it is God's will that the next generation is preserved, and that parents assume primary responsibility for getting biblical and doctrinal knowledge into the hearts of their children. When the Word says that another generation arose who did not know the Lord, it is because parents had neglected their God-ordained responsibilities. Failure to teach our children the Word of God will not only deprive them of God's precious truths, but also, it will rob them of eternal joy that only God can bring. Let us Praise God for the work of the local church, and its critical role in the training of the Next Generation of Believers!.
