#### MLK DAY 2020 AT BROOKLAND BAPTIST CHURCH

Civil rights leader Nelson B. Rivers III will be the keynote speaker for the Brookland Baptist Brotherhood and NABCJ's annual Martin Luther King Jr. Breakfast on January 18, 2020 at 9 am.

The Very Reverend Bishop Frederick C. James, Retired, will be awarded the Brookland Baptist Brotherhood Martin Luther King Jr. Drum Major Medallion. The Let's Keep the Dream Alive! breakfast will be held in the Brookland Banquet and Conference Center, 1045 Sunset Blvd., West Columbia, SC 29169. Tickets are \$20.

The breakfast is sponsored by the Brookland Baptist Brotherhood and the South Carolina Chapter of the National Association of Blacks in Criminal Justice (NABCJ). The theme, "Remembering Our Past. Defining Our Future," acknowledges the continued struggle for civil and human rights, and the importance of devising strategies for the future, according to Dr. O'Neal Smalls, one of the organizers. "This is no ordinary time! Our values and government are being challenged," Dr. Smalls noted.

The Rev. Rivers is pastor of Charity Missionary Baptist Church in North Charleston. He has worked at every level of the NAACP including president, North Charleston Branch; executive director, South Carolina State Conference; director, Southeast Region; chief national operating officer; chief of field operations; and vice president of Stakeholder Relations. His civil rights work led to the first-time election of more than 300 African Americans to public offices in South Carolina between 1986 and 1994. He was a leading organizer of the largest civil rights demonstration in the history of South Carolina when over 50,000 marched on the State Capitol in January 2000 to demand the removal of the Confederate Flag. After 15 years of persistent protest, Rev. Rivers was present when on July 10, 2015 the Confederate Battle Flag was removed from the front of the South Carolina State Capitol building.

Bishop James served as president of the Sumter Branch of the NAACP and founded the first government subsidized housing project in South Carolina. He was responsible for securing the accreditation of Allen University, a Historically Black College, and was a member of President Bill Clinton's delegation to Nelson Mandela's inauguration as President of South Africa. #### The 2020 US Census is of critical importance to South Carolina's future

The United States Census. Many people do not understand the critical role it plays in shaping our country's political and economic landscapes. Yet, its importance was so self-evident to the Framers of the Constitution they placed it in the document's sixth sentence. However, not even they could have envisioned it being the primary catalyst for the appropriation of hundreds of billions of dollars to states, regional and local governments, cities, and communities.

In 2016 nearly \$880 billion went to states and other recipients through federal grants, loans, and other disbursements based on 2010 US Census figures. South Carolina received nearly \$12.7 billion of this funding to support programs in education, foster care, healthcare, transportation infrastructure, vocational rehabilitation and unemployment.

Yet, census data is not only crucial in obtaining funding to aid our state's most vulnerable populations. It also helped South Carolina gain the Seventh Congressional District for the United States House of Representatives in 2011. Moreover, businesses use this data to determine economic development and investment prospects in communities.

Unfortunately, the 2020 US Census is not being treated with the urgency it deserves. For the advancement of our state, it is imperative that a complete count of all South Carolina residents occur. Residency is a key term because the census (contrary to popular myth) will count everyone, not just citizens. The goal is to count all persons living in South Carolina, whether they be citizens or non-citizens. This means counting our homeless population, college students, migrant workers, prisoners, and others. It is also important to note that by law census data is kept confidential for 72 years (even from other agencies within the federal government).

For these, and many other reasons, it is critical that the state obtain a complete count on the 2020 United States Census. Beginning in early March 2020, all persons who reside in our state (citizens and non-citizens) will be able to be counted in the census. This can be done online, by way of a printed questionnaire, or by calling an official US Census number.

Furthermore, the US Census Bureau has designated April 1, 2020 as "Census Day," meaning everyone residing in the United States on April 1, 2020 is to be included in the count. According to the US Census Bureau, some of the groups most at risk of being undercounted are: children five years of age and younger, residents of rural areas, undocumented immigrants, migrant workers, racial and ethnic minorities, low-income persons, and persons experiencing homelessness.

At this time, the State of South Carolina has not devoted funds to ensure a complete and accurate accounting of residents. Thus, it is imperative that residents and communities do everything within their power to ensure they are counted. To do so, South Carolinians can call their state elected officials to impress upon them the importance of designating funding through a joint resolution for the census. Persons can also be sure to complete census forms and ensure their family, friends, and community members do so. This is vital for our future!

For more information on the 2020 US Census – and to apply for temporary employment with the United States Census Bureau – visit 2020Census.gov. Furthermore, additional materials regarding the 2020 US Census can be found on the South Carolina Commission for Minority Affairs' website at CMA.sc.gov/census-2020-south-carolina. There are also opportunities for organizations and community groups to apply for grants to ensure complete counts through the United Way Association of South Carolina.

#### THE WEST COLUMBIA TIGERS- NATIONAL CHAMPIONS



The West Columbia Tigers Youth Football Program started their holiday celebrations early after its 10 and under team (10U) captured their first ever national title at the Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) National Championship Series played earlier this month at Orlando, Fla. West Columbia blanked Future Stars United of Lakeland, Fla., 38-0, to capture the championship.

The Tigers' history-making season also included becoming the first South Carolina AAU youth football program to win championships in four age divisions in one year. West Columbia's 12U, 10U, 8U, and 6U teams all won state titles. The 6U team also won a national title, while the 12U and 8U teams advanced to the semifinals before losing in the playoffs.

It's a great feeling, said Head Coach Jermaine Odom. "It's great for the kids, parents, coaches, the community -- everyone who has supported this program. This was a nine-month process. We had some problems early in the season but we knew this was a talented team. Once they began playing together, the team got better and better as the season progressed. But we knew from the beginning they were capable of winning a championship."

West Columbia's 10U team rolled to an unblemished 16-0 record. The Tigers were 7-0 in pool play at the National Championships. "We played as hard as we could in every game. That's why we were 16-0," said Kai Finkebeimer, who earned "Lineman of the Game" honors when the Tigers defeated the Dillon Predators to win the state title. "We did not want to lose in the state finals like we did last year. We kept our heads up, stayed focus, and went all the way," said Finkbeimer, a fifth grader at Northside Christian Academy.

West Columbia Tigers football program is coordinated by the Brookland Lakeview Empowerment Center (BLEC), a 94,000 square-foot facility located on Batchelor Street in West Columbia. The BLEC offers a variety of activities to more than 200 youth including football, basketball, baseball, track, cheerleading and dancing, in addition to tutoring and mentoring. The BLEC functions as one of several community outreach initiatives conducted by Brookland Baptist Church under the leadership of the church's senior pastor, the Rev. Dr. Charles B. Jackson, Sr. The facility was formerly Lakeview Senior High School, an all-black high school in Columbia that existed from 1925 to 1968 prior to the desegregation of public schools in South Carolina.

Bennie Sulton, a 1964 Lakeview High School graduate, serves as chairman of the BLEC's Board of Directors. To Sulton, the Tigers' football success is the continuation of the legacy of outstanding achievements that he and other alumni established as students decades ago.

"Lakeview High School had a well-deserved reputation for excellence in athletics and academics," said Sulton who was a member of the 1963 Lakeview football team that was undefeated and captured a state title. The school also won back-to-back championships in 1954 and 1955. "Many of our graduates launched successful careers in business, theology, medicine, education, government and other professions from what we learned here at Lakeview High School," said Sulton, who returned to Columbia following his retirement from a Fortune 500 company.

For Darrell Hutto, director of the BLEC's youth programs since 2007, West Columbia's third trip to the nationals was indeed a charm. His teams had reached the nationals on two previous occasions, but fell short of the championship. This year was different. "I am very proud of the way our kids played throughout the season and at the nationals," Hutto said. "It was an uphill battle. You look forward to making it to Orlando but you know it's going to be a tough environment because practically all of the teams are from Florida. But this team was determined to win a championship and the coaches, parents, and everyone else were all on the same page regarding what it would take for us to win. We created a family atmosphere and when everyone works together, this is what you get -- a national championship."

Hutto said that in addition to winning, he was equally impressed with the personal development and maturity he witnessed from the players during the season.



"They formed bonds, friendships and trust in each other that made them stronger as a team," Hutto said. "This whole experience was more than about football. Some of these kids had never traveled outside of South Carolina. They received an education about other areas of the country and were able to play football in the process. We hope that the athletic and academic programs at the BLEC will inspire and help prepare these kids for productive and meaningful lives in their communities and beyond. We are very proud of their accomplishments in football and with the other sports teams. But we want them to understand that excelling in the classroom is even more important."







Although we are well into the New Year, it's not too late to make resolutions in those areas where you want to see improvement. To help you, here are some ways actually to achieve your financial or personal goals so that you can be among those with resolutions that are still intact at the end of the year.

#### Make a specific goal.

Let's assume that one of your resolutions in the area of personal finances is something like this, "I will get out of debt and save more money [this year]." That is a good resolution. But now you have to get some details in your plan. Your next step is to define how much you want to accomplish and record them in the form of detailed, measurable goals. For example:

"I will pay off \$8,500 in credit card balances within 12 months so that I can be debt free.

"I will save \$1,500 in an emergency savings account within 12 months so that I no longer have to rely upon my credit cards." Develop a plan to achieve your goal. To achieve your debt reduction and savings goals, try the following: 1. Download a free budgeting plan at crown.org.

Spend a few hours working through the numbers to determine how much money you earn and how much you spend each month. This will help you determine if you need to a) decrease your spending, b) increase your income or, c) do both in order to have the amount of money you need to apply towards debt and save some each month. Do not omit this step!

**2.** Establish a separate bank account to automatically withdraw the amount you need to save each month. Once you have made the automatic transfer, use the account only to pay off the credit cards and nothing else. If you have established your budget correctly, you may have a surplus of \$62 per pay period or \$125/month remaining and \$1,500 in emergency savings by the time you reach the 12th month.

3. Realize victory over lack of discipline.

Discipline and self-control must be applied one day at a time. If you can establish one daily discipline and stick with it for three weeks, you will form a new habit. A spiritual battle will be waged to keep you from believing that you can be disciplined. The enemy wants to rob you of the fruit of the Holy Spirit and cause you constantly to feel defeated. Make this a matter of <u>daily prayer</u>, asking God to help you live one day at a time, to give you self-control and perseverance. Like any endeavor, you may experience setbacks, frustrations or obstacles that discourage you. That is when you must not give in to the temptation to quit. It will be far more encouraging at the end of the year if it simply takes you longer or a few more attempts to achieve your goals than if you had quit early on.

#### 4. Set a reward for success.

It is a fact that events that cause a strong emotional reaction are more vividly etched in our memories than those that are emotionally neutral. We can remember days of grief, joy or fear in more detail and for far longer than just a normal day in our lives. If you have had a lifetime of stress when it comes to managing money, use those bad memories as motivation to eliminate the continual fear, anxiety and worry about money that have become associated with trying to solve these problems. Imagine life without that emotional drain and use it to motivate you to persevere toward the opposite end of the emotional scale – joy, peace and a sense of being prepared. Now with a mental picture of your goal in mind, how would you like to celebrate on Dec. 31 if you have achieved your New Year's resolution? Be honest. Would you like to eat out at a favorite restaurant, give a gift to an important person in your life, be able to be more generous? These are all perfectly acceptable forms of rewards if they motivate you to finish your goals. Since we are all built to desire rewards, this is an important element in your plan.

#### 5. Get some help.

Finally, don't go at it alone. Team up with a friend that wants to accomplish a similar goal or join a small group that can encourage you to stay the course. God has designed all of us to operate within a body of like-minded believers. Together, let's make 2020 the year that, with God's help, we stick to our resolutions.


