# The Brookland Food Bank Reopens!

The Brookland Baptist Church Food Bank (BBC-FB) is once again fulfilling its mission of serving those in need within our communities. Its spiritual mandate comes from Matthew 25:35-36. "....for I was hungry, and you fed Me. And when I was thirsty, you gave Me something to drink. I was alone as a stranger, and you welcomed Me into your homes and into your lives. I was naked, and you gave me clothes to wear;...." (NLT). It is our sincere intention that we provide not only food for the physically hungry, but also great portions of love and kindness for their spiritual and emotional needs.

We are a non-profit partner of the local Harvest Hope Food Bank. We are one of twenty-six affiliated locations in South Carolina. Food is distributed at our location on at 1218 Bachelor Street in West Columbia at the Brookland Lakeview Empowerment Center (the former Northside Middle School).

We provide pre-packed bags of food to anyone in need from the surrounding area with an emphasis on vulnerable populations that include: seniors with low-incomes and minimal resources, single parent homes with low/no income or household emergencies (i.e. job losses, fires, weather-related destruction), and recent incarcerates who are re-entering society. In order to receive food or clothing, each person must bring two forms of identification to include a photo ID and a proof of residence (example: current utility bill).

# Nov. 3rd: ELECTION DAY POLLS OPEN 7 AM TO 7 PM

In person absentee voting begins on Oct. 5th at your county's voter registration office.

The deadline to request an absentee ballot is Oct. 30th.

Mail-in ballots must be RECEIVED by Nov. 3rd. Due to the

COVID-19 pandemic, expect delays, so send in your ballot

as early as possible to make sure it is counted.

October 2nd: Deadline to register to vote in person

October 4th: Deadline to register to vote online

October 5th: Deadline to register to vote by mail (application must be sent by this date)



# Vote early

South Carolina voters can also vote before Election Day through a process called absentee in-person voting. The period for absentee in-person voting runs from Monday, October 5, 2020 to Monday, November 2, 2020, but dates and hours may vary based on where you live.

# What to bring

You will be asked to show photo ID to vote in South Carolina. Acceptable forms include: South Carolina driver's license or South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles ID Card (includes standard license and REAL ID); South Carolina Concealed Weapons Permit; South Carolina voter registration card with photo; US military ID (Includes all Department of Defense Photo IDs and Veterans Affairs Benefits Card); or US passport (Includes US Passport ID Card).



# **American Cancer Society Breast Cancer Screening Guideline**

American Cancer Society breast cancer screening guidelines are developed to save lives by finding breast cancer early, when treatment is more likely to be successful. The Society regularly reviews the science and updates screening recommendations when new evidence suggests that a change may be needed.

The latest guideline applies to women at average risk for breast cancer. Among other recommendations, it says all women should begin having yearly mammograms by age 45, and can change to having mammograms every other year beginning at age 55. Women should have the choice to

# What are screening tests?

The goal of screening tests for breast cancer is to find it before it causes symptoms (like a lump that can be felt). **Screening** refers to tests and exams used to find a disease in people who don't have any symptoms. **Early detection** means finding and diagnosing a disease earlier than if you'd waited for symptoms to start.

Breast cancers found during screening exams are more likely to be smaller and still confined to the breast. The size of a breast cancer and how far it has spread are some of the most important factors in predicting the **prognosis** (outlook) of a woman with this disease.

# American Cancer Society screening recommendations women at

# average breast cancer risk

These guidelines are for women at **average risk** for breast cancer. For screening purposes, a woman is considered to be at average risk if she doesn't have a personal history of breast cancer, a strong family history of breast cancer, or a genetic mutation known to increase risk of breast cancer (such as in a *BRCA* gene), and has not had chest radiation therapy before the age of 30. (See below for guidelines for women at high risk.)

Women between 40 and 44 have the option to start screening with a mammogram every year.

Women 45 to 54 should get mammograms every year.

Women 55 and older can switch to a mammogram every other year, or they can choose to continue yearly mammograms. Screening should continue as long as a woman is in good health and is expected to live at least 10 more years.

**All women** should understand what to expect when getting a mammogram for breast cancer screening – what the test can and cannot do.

Clinical breast exams are not recommended for breast cancer screening among average-risk women at any age.

Women who are at **high risk** for breast cancer based on certain factors should get a <u>breast</u> MRI and a mammogram every year, typically starting at age 30. This includes women who:

• Have a lifetime risk of breast cancer of about 20% to 25% or greater, according to risk assessment tools that are based mainly on family history (see below)

Have a known *BRCA1* or *BRCA2* gene mutation (based on having had genetic testing)

- Have a first-degree relative (parent, brother, sister, or child) with a *BRCA1* or *BRCA2* gene mutation, and have not had genetic testing themselves
- Had radiation therapy to the chest when they were between the ages of 10 and 30 years
- Have Li-Fraumeni syndrome, Cowden syndrome, or Bannayan-Riley-Ruvalcaba syndrome, or have first-degree relatives with one of these syndromes



# Breast Cancer Awareness Month: Early screening saves lives

COLUMBIA, S.C. (WIS) - October 1 kicks off the beginning of Breast Cancer Awareness Month — a vitally important time to raise funds and support outreach programs for women and men all over the world. This year, the month took on a different meaning for me, as I struggled with a health scare that reminded me why, even during this period of uncertainty, it's so important to take care of ourselves — both physically and emotionally. The COVID-19 pandemic has caused many women to fall behind on their annual health appointments, which doctors say could have serious consequences.

Dr. Douglas Bull with the Prisma Health Breast Center said he's seen several women push back or cancel appointments.

"There was a gap there...we don't want women to just put it off till next year because we often see, for lack of a better term, sometimes a disaster story if a woman puts off screening for two to three years."

Bull went on to say that early screenings, annual mammograms for most women over 40, and keeping regular appointments with your primary care physicians is key. "It's what will help us detect and diagnose whatever is wrong," he said. With COVID precautions in mind, I still wanted to keep my appointments. So, this year, an annual visit to my OBGYN found a lump in my breast my doctor believed could be fibroadenoma - a benign tumor that can be common. After a trip to the Prisma Health Breast Center, an ultrasound revealed the lump was not anything serious, just a mass of lumpy tissue. A relief for sure – but for some women, skipping that yearly appointment could be a different story.

For South Carolina resident Dawn Hunt -- a breast cancer survivor and the chair of the Walk for Life and Famously Hot Pink Half Marathon, 10K and 5K walk -- early detection and an annual exam caught her breast cancer early. "I was 45, following a routine mammogram...found one tumor and then a second," she explained. She said before her diagnosis, she had friends who had never received a mammogram. Now, her platform and her story is an inspiration all over the state as she continues to push for education and funding to support the women and families of those who have breast cancer.

"This event, it brings awareness...but it's really about year-round education and support." This year is the 30th anniversary of Walk for Life. Though there won't be a big pink finish line in downtown Columbia this year, Prisma is moving to a virtual Walk for Life and Famously Hot Pink Half Marathon, 5K + 10K this fall.

# Fight the flu!

# Parents and kids, join us to help fight the flu. Influenza (the flu) is a serious illness you can get from anyone infected.

Prisma Health is helping protect you and your family with free flu shots throughout Richland. Lexington, Fairfield, Kershaw and Sumter counties. The flu shot is available for anyone six months and older. Flu shots will be administered by drive-through, with the exception of the Prisma Health Nine Medical Park Lobby location. For drive-through locations, there will be limited capacity to provide vaccines outside of the vehicle for children, if needed. Flu shots at Prisma Health, Nine Medical Park, will be administered in the first floor lobby area every Wednesday and Thursday in October, 3–6 p.m. Please wear a short-sleeve shirt or loose-fitting clothing that can easily roll up to assist with vaccines. Face masks or shields will be required, along with temperature checks. Anyone with a fever will not be allowed a flu shot vaccine.

Consent forms are required and available at each site. Children under the age of 16 require a parent/guardian signature. Flu shots are available on a first-come, first-served basis. See the reverse side for more information.
