Fall Back to Go Forward Matthew 10:39 Reverend Charles B. Jackson, Jr., Executive Pastor



The fall season is now upon us. However, it is an amazing thing when God speaks to us and we can hear God clearly. God speaks to us in myriad ways; through meditation, prayer, sleep, through our dreams early in the morning. In the states that acknowledge daylight saving time (DST), they practice setting the clocks back one hour in the fall, in order to make better use of natural daylight. Therefore, when we fall back we gain an extra hour.

Sometimes in life we have to do that as well. We have to fall back in order to gain something; maybe a better perspective, new insight, or even a different outlook on a situation. We have to allow ourselves to disengage, disassociate or just step back for a moment. This may include detaching ourselves from some people, things, habits or ideas that just may be keeping us from moving forward.

In Matthew 10:39 Jesus says, "Whoever finds their life will lose it, and whoever loses their life for my sake will find it." The idea is centered around losing to win again. Sometimes we will lose in life. Sometimes we will fail at doing somethings in life. There is no success story without having a moment of failure. During that fail moment we have to focus on the revelation and not on the situation in order to gain a better perspective of where we are in the "right now." Sometimes we can become too focused on moving forward that we lose perspective of the "right now." Although we may believe in an "Always Forward Gospel" which is getting through whatever we may be dealing with (not necessarily getting over but pressing forward) there are also times when we just have to fall back and accept the lost in order to win again.

Gain a better perspective! See things differently! Pull yourself together! Get a level-head! Push selfish desires aside!

We have to get to the point where we set aside our pride and allow God to take the wheel because we realized that we cannot do it on our own. Brookland Baptist Food Bank



The Brookland Baptist Church Food Bank (BBC-FB) is once again fulfilling its mission of serving those in need within our communities. Its spiritual mandate comes from Matthew 25:35 -36. "....for I was hungry, and you fed Me. And when I was thirsty, you gave Me something to drink. I was alone as a stranger, and you welcomed Me into your homes and into your lives. I was naked, and you gave me clothes to wear;...." (NLT). It is our sincere intention that we provide not only food for the physically hungry, but also great portions of love and kindness for their spiritual and emotional needs.

We are a non-profit partner of the local Harvest Hope Food Bank. We are one of twenty-six affiliated locations in South Carolina. Food is distributed at our location on at 1218 Bachelor Street in West Columbia at the Brookland Lakeview Empowerment Center (the former Northside Middle School). Our regularly scheduled food distribution time is every Monday between the hours of 11:00 AM and 1:00 PM, except on holidays.

We provide pre-packed bags of food to anyone in need from the surrounding area with an emphasis on vulnerable populations that include: seniors with low-incomes and minimal resources, single parent homes with low/no income or household emergencies (i.e. job losses, fires, weather-related destruction), and recent incarcerates who are re-entering society. In order to receive food or clothing, each person must bring two forms of identification to include a photo ID and a proof of residence (example: current utility bill).

In addition to our weekly food distribution program on Mondays, the BBC-FB participates in a backpack food program at Fulmer Elementary School of Lexington County. We also occasionally provide special food baskets to Brookland Baptist Senior Warriors.

An assigned member of the pastoral staff will be available for spiritual advisement during the designated hours of food distribution. Although food is being provided for the physical being, we would like to address the whole person by also addressing the spiritual need as well.







A Few U.S. Breast Cancer Statistics

- About 1 in 8 U.S. women (about 12%) will develop invasive breast cancer over the course of her lifetime.
- In 2019, an estimated 268,600 new cases of invasive breast cancer are expected to be diagnosed in women in the U.S., along with 62,930 new cases of non-invasive (in situ) breast cancer.
- About 2,670 new cases of invasive breast cancer are expected to be diagnosed in men in 2019. A man's lifetime risk of breast cancer is about 1 in 883
- Breast cancer incidence rates in the U.S. began decreasing in the year 2000, after increasing for the
 previous two decades. They dropped by 7% from 2002 to 2003 alone. One theory is that this decrease
 was partially due to the reduced use of hormone replacement therapy (HRT) by women after the results
 of a large study called the Women's Health Initiative were published in 2002. These results suggested a
 connection between HRT and increased breast cancer risk.
- About 41,760 women in the U.S. are expected to die in 2019 from breast cancer, though death rates have been decreasing since 1989. Women under 50 have experienced larger decreases. These decreases are thought to be the result of treatment advances, earlier detection through screening, and increased awareness
- In women under 45, breast cancer is more common in African-American women than white women. Overall, African-American women are more likely to die of breast cancer. For Asian, Hispanic, and Native-American women, the risk of developing and dying from breast cancer is lower.


