Women: 'Be' The Difference!

I Greet You Most Cordially in The Name of our Precious Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. As a sign of solidarity and gratitude, I wish to thank Brookland for 26 years of trailblazing as one of, if not the first African American Baptist Church in South Carolina to celebrate Women's History Month. In this effort, you bring attention to the unique and significant gift of every woman, her contributions to society, her significant influences in the workplace, her vital role in her home and community, and her vibrant role in the church.

I wish to thank the incredible members of the 2021 Women's History Month Committee for their unwavering efforts to organize an applicable theme for this year's Women's History Month celebration: **"Her Story: Empowering Women to 'BE' The Difference."** As I do, I am reminded of a phrase etched in my mind some years ago which, in essence says that "A lot of people failed at what you have accomplished, simply because they were too busy finding problems while you spent endless hours finding solutions." Well Done committee members!

We will celebrate the entire month of March with a weekly focus. On **Thursday**, **March 4th**:"Her Story: Empowering Women to "BE" The Difference; **Thursday**, **March 11th**, The Impact of COVID on Academics; **Thursday**, **March 18th**, Mental Health and Coping During COVID; and culminating on **Thursday**, **March 25th** with a panel discussion on Empowering Women Through Inspiration and Collaboration. The ZOOM sessions will be held every Thursday starting at 7:00 pm and run no later than 8:30 pm

Taking up the theme the committee addressed, "Her Story: Empowering Women to 'BE' The Difference." I pray that this article will speak directly to the heart, mind, and soul of every woman and to reflect with her on the prospects of what it means to be a woman in our time.

So, as we begin our dialogue on the challenge to 'Be' the Difference., I will begin with a word of thanks.

I give thanks to the great work of our Sovereign God for the mysterious plan regarding the vocation and mission of women in the world, and for all that women have accomplished in and through Him throughout history.

I say thank you, to women in our time who are mothers and to those who have stepped in the role of motherhood / You have sheltered so many within yourselves and given so many children memorable and unique experiences of joy.

Thank you, women who are wives in our time! **Titus 2:4** calls for wives "to love their husbands." A good description of the kind of love your husband needs is "unconditional acceptance." In other words, accept your husband just as he is—an imperfect person.

Thank you, women who are daughters and women who are sisters in our time! You do not hold a second place in our Father's plan. You are an absolute essential part of His great plan.

Thank you, women who work in our time! You make essential contributions to the growth of an ever-growing economy and a strong political culture.

Thank you, women who are set aside for God's use! You are following the example of the greatest of women, the Mother of Jesus Christ and other women who demonstrated remarkable courage and fidelity during times of crisis. **Thank you**, every woman, for the amazing fact of being a woman. We are daughters of God, endowed with a Divine birthright.

Today is an exciting time in which to live and be the woman God has called us to be, however challenging these times may be. Our challenge is God's opportunity to show Himself great in our lives and work greatness for His Kingdom. There are several instances in the Bible where God positioned "Glass Ceiling women to "Be" the Difference in the crisis of nations.

I think of Queen Esther, who became God's instrument for the deliverance of the chosen race. It was a crisis for her when Mordecai said: "Who knoweth whether thou art come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" With prayer and fasting she and other women besought the Lord. "I will go in unto the king," she said, ". . . and if I perish, I perish." She met the crisis bravely. She went to the king and he extended the golden scepter. Her prayers were answered. Esther, lovely person that she was, beauti-ful in character and form, met the crisis bravely.

Another woman God used to 'Be' the Difference during her time was Deborah, leader and judge of Israel. The crisis of her people was her own personal crisis too. At that time Jabin was king of Canaan. He reigned in Hazor and he sent Sisera with his host to fight against Israel. Deborah met the crisis with courage and wisdom. She summoned Barak, the captain of the Lord's army. "Hath not the Lord God of Israel commanded," said she, "saying Go and draw toward mount Tabor, and take with thee ten thousand men of the children of Naphtali and of the children of Zebulun?" (Judges 4:6). But Barak the man trembled. He said to Deborah the woman, "If thou wilt go with me, then I will go: but if thou wilt not go with me, then I will not go." And Deborah said, "I will surely go with thee." But, she explained, "the journey that thou takest shall not be for thine honour; for the Lord shall sell Sisera into the hand of a woman. So, the victory was won by two women —Deborah and Jael. God has given to many women the victory women who did not fail in times of crisis. They were called to "Be" the Difference.

On January 20, 2021 God called Kamala Harris to "Shatter the glass ceiling" and answer the call for all women. She became the first African American/South Asian American woman to serve as Vice-President of the United States of America, one of the second highest level of governmental office in America. We are so honored that God, in His Sovereignty has called her to this high position of service for such a time as this. Women, the world has not seen all its best women yet. I believe God has a plan for women of the church to become "Shattering Ceiling Breakers." Yes, He has called you to "Be" the Difference.

Finally, when we face big crisis, we need courage women with strong faith, strong in cour-age, large in their love and affection, with broad, keen minds, hearts aflame with a passion for souls; women in love with Jesus as Mary was, women courageous for Jesus as Esther was, women of faith like Deborah and Jael.
