Til Now We Stand at Last: The Journey Continues By Christina L. Myers

"Keep your eyes straight ahead; ignore all sideshow distractions. Watch your step, and the road will stretch out smooth before you. Look neither right nor left; leave evil in the dust."

— Proverbs 4: 25-27 (MSG)

Black History Month serves as a time of reflection, celebration, thanksgiving and embracing our African American heritage. However, neither a calendar designation nor a national declaration can adequately embody all the trials yet triumphs, pain that transformed into power, grief in time that yielded gratitude that speaks to the complex yet beautiful narrative of the Black experience we commemorate today.

Our history is too rich, too ripe and too robust, brilliant, bright and bountiful to only reflect on whence we came during the shortest month of the year. Our birthright, as ordained by God our Father and secured through Jesus Christ our Savior, has continuously been under attack as systemic mechanisms in society have perpetually tried to hinder our progress, steal our purpose and stifle our power.

The objectifying institution of slavery, established by those who proclaimed to be followers of our Creator God while undermining His omnipotence, separated families, forcing precious lives into the hands of those who devalued the invaluable.

And that same elitist mentality persisted through generations and is present today in a sometimesunjust criminal justice system, unequal employment opportunities and lack of access to quality education and healthcare. This is exacerbated as we navigate through a society where some still hold this false notion that one race is more superior to another. African Americans have always faced difficult times, and now is no different.

Yet, the very Breath that blew life into us has sustained many of generations despite the I nsurmountable odds that were created to prevent our progress. This nation and its lasting successes have been built on the bruised backbones of our ancestors. Their resilience and resolve sustained them through generations of torment and trauma, and their strength, intellect and unwavering faith gave them the foresight to know that there must be a better tomorrow — if not for themselves, for future generations.

Our country is seemingly in a period of "awakening" where eyes are being opened to the harsh realities of what has always been present and prevalent simply for breathing while Black.

In spite of it all, the same Spirit that empowered a woman born into slavery to usher enslaved people to freedom; the same Spirit that gave a 25-year-old donned in a trench coat and backpack the courage to hold the frontlines, staring into the eyes of men who refused to allow him to cross the Edmond Pettus Bridge in his fight to allow us the freedom to vote; the same Spirit that laid it upon a southern Baptist preacher's heart to proclaim the love of God while demanding equality for all God's children despite the color of one's skin or the content of one's character; the same Spirit that inspired a community organizer turned Senator to run and become the first African



American President of the United States; the same Spirit that positioned the first woman, Black and South Asian who hailed from a historically Black university to occupy the Office of Vice President; and that same sustaining Spirit that flowed through the veins of our enslaved ancestors has never failed, is very much alive and ever present in our lives today.

We have accomplished much as a people, and it took several individuals firm in their convictions, willing to work together to strive to make a better future for the collective. However, there is work yet to be done.

How are we shaping our history? What collective legacy are we leaving for future generations? Will they, too, feel the inspiration that we've felt through the lasting legacy of C.T. Vivian, Thurgood Marshall and Fannie Lou Hamer? Will they, too, be inspired to live a life of service?

What are we willing to sacrifice, fight for, dedicate our time and energy toward in order to ensure that the faces of those Black and brown children, who are not yet in our immediate view, will help carry the baton for future generations?

We are uniquely positioned to take that which can ostensibly be challenging and proclaim without hesitation or resignation that Black lives more than matter – Black lives are precious, powerful, purpose-driven, full of possibilities and persistent in our mission to use the time we are blessed with here on earth to be a blessing to others.

Stony the road we trod, bitter the chastening rod,
Felt in the days when hope unborn had died;
Yet with a steady beat, have not our weary feet
Come to the place for which our fathers sighed?
We have come over a way that with tears has been watered,
We have come, treading our path through the blood of the slaughtered,
Out from the gloomy past, 'Til now we stand at last
Where the white gleam of our bright star is cast.

"Lift Every Voice and Sing," pinned by James Weldon Johnson, has served as our anthem and continues to speak to the hearts of the African American people – more endearing and enduring as we embark on this journey called life.

Let us continue to celebrate the power of knowing we have come this far by faith. The journey from the gloomy past starts with you. What path will you tread?
